The BMNA Community Project program has been in place for the last 17 years. Projects from past years include:


- Awnings at Greenhouse Salon and Spa in collaboration with the Racial Justice Committee

- Garden plantings at Anwatin/Bryn Mawr school sign
- Installation of an original Stacia Goodman mosaic in downtown Bryn Mawr
- Support for Minneapolis Nature Pre-School and Nature Play Adventure Camp for 4-7 year olds
- Traffic speed indication sign
- A bee hotel placed in J.D. Rivers Children's Garden
- Construction of a bench at Brownie Lake
- Buckthorn removal in Chestnut Park/Fruen Mill area over six years
- Construction of a Little Library on Penn Avenue
- 2011 Pedal to Pedal garden bike ride; which culminated in a renewal of our alternate year garden tour program
- Downtown banner project, part of a joint City of Minneapolis/BMNA NRP project
- Ash Bore identification project: Our team identified more than 800 ash trees in Bryn Mawr and presented neighbors with a variety of options
- Energy Challenge. Over 80 neighbors joined the challenge and received statistics about their energy use. From this project we leveraged our relationship with SEE to receive two cash awards that benefited BMNA initiatives

Redesigning the Upton garden in Area 4. Our first community project; we completed a remake of the Upton garden

# Call to Order at 6:35 PM.

Agenda approved. Minutes from October 9, 2024, moved, seconded. Motion carried.

### City of Minneapolis -Councilperson Katie Cashman

Cashman discussed the purchase of parcels of land on Vincent Ave So, distributed a flyer responding to six frequently asked questions. Purchaser met with city staff to discuss plans for the property. Currently there is a public right of way on Vincent Ave So to the border of school property; owner indicated they may request Vincent be vacated. Vacating a street involves a multi-step process including a lengthy application, city staff recommendation, a public hearing at a planning commission meeting, and city council approval. Cashman anticipated that it would be a lengthy process. Cashman stated that it is difficult to obtain street vacations, there have been several proposals for this property in the past that have not come to fruition. City staffer Brette Hjelle informed Cashman it has taken years for other street vacation applications. Process for applying for a vacation can be accessed online https://www.minneapolismn.gov/gov ernment/programs-initiatives/streetor-alley-vacation. A city planner has been assigned to work with the owner. Cashman answered questions from neighbors in attendance and Board members. The city does not do land swaps. The city has not been saving the street for future development. Cashman has encouraged owner to engage with the neighborhood association and encouraged working with crime prevention specialist Shannon McDonough to address difficulties occurring between owner and neighbors. shannon.mcdonough@minneapolismn.go v | (612) 398-4707. Cashman said a 311-call instigated cleaning up rubble on Vincent Ave So. Board members asked for a separate meeting to give neighbors the opportunity to discuss their concerns. Steve Harvey agreed to spearhead setting it up. Discussed possibility of contacting a mediator regarding neighborhood issues. Cashman discussed the situation at the former Joffe clinic. It was neglected and demolished. Tents set up behind the building were on BNSF land. BNSF removed the encampment. We Win Institute has purchased 2801 Wayzata Blvd in Area 2. Cashman is seeking input on the city budget through a survey she distributed.

# **Crime Prevention Specialist Report -**

Stabbing in early November in Area 2. Board discussed what constitutes reporting a crime. Haven Stephens will contact Shannon McDonough, have the process explained, and write an article for the Bugle. Carol Chapman supported the idea of having access to a mediator for issues that are occurring on Vincent and in Area 9.

# Communications & Development Coordinator Report -Lynda Shaheen written report

Communications included publicizing Sip and Stroll, bike outings, Meadow's ribbon cutting. Met with new business owner, developers for website, neighbor working on branding and marketing across all platforms. Contacted City Councilperson Katie Cashman's office regarding property purchased on Vincent, Park Board Commissioner Elizabeth Shaffer about Eloise Butler construction, We Win Institute on Wayzata Blvd, Steve Minn, Lupe Development, about trail access to Wirth Park, and service coordinator at Wirth On The Woods. Distributed diversity survey from City NCR staff to all Board members. Development activities included submitting request to extend NCR contract for 2025, work on NCR funding documentation. Donations are \$20,616 compared to \$16,437 in 2023, Sip and Stroll-Items Sales \$294 compared to \$165 in 2023.

Sip and Stroll went smoothly, great turn out. Big Hill Books perfect place for check-in and selling merch. Many neighbors said it is their favorite event, businesses appreciate this event. Low-cost event that continues to grow. Harvest Dinner Nov. 21. Blood Drive Nov. 22. Trying to locate the sandwich board from the corner of the church. Preservation Minneapolis Walking Tour will take place in

mid-September 2025. Winter/Spring Fest, meeting with La Dona on November 23rd to discuss holding Winter/Spring Fest at La Dona again.

plans. Would be helpful to have summations about crimes.

Parks – Chris Etz/Barry Schade
Accolades for neighborhood advocating for parks, specifically for continued projects at the Meadows. Eloise Butler is expanding. Commissioner Shaffer asking for input on marijuana use in parks. Brian Treece requested funding for lights on rinks in Mead-

ows. Meadows is not one of the planned rink closures.

Neil Trembley reported on Cedar Lake Park Association working to acquire remnant land in Cedar Lake Corridor.

Working to get hoses reclaimed for the winter. Thanks to Kathy Ripke for work on the Newton Triangle. Got loads of pavers from Minnesota Green society. Downtown planters in progress,



# Minneapolis to Replace Lead Water Infrastructure for Property Owners

Tsing new state and federal funding, the City of Minneapolis has started work to replace aging water infrastructure for property owners across the city. The City has completed a citywide inventory of all water service lines. The water service line is the pipe that runs from the water main in the street to the meter inside a property. In Minneapolis, the entire water service line is owned by the property owner.

Residents who have either a lead water service line, a galvanized water service line requiring replacement or a water service line of unknown material will receive a letter from the City. The letter has information about the water service line material, steps that can be taken to minimize lead exposure in drinking water, and an update on the City's effort to replace lead water service lines. An interactive map of the water service line inventory can be viewed on the City's website.

# How we know our tap water is safe?

Minneapolis water is tested hundreds of times a day to ensure it's

safe to drink, and it has always met all federal drinking water standards for lead. The water is treated to make sure lead from pipes does not get into the water.

This year, using the new grant funds, we began proactively replacing lead service lines at no cost to the homeowner. In total, we will replace around 400 lead service lines using grant funds in 2024 with a plan to replace 1,000 in 2025. This effort will continue until we have replaced or attempted to replace every lead service line in the city (replacement requires the property owner's consent). It is important to note this is not an opt-in program. The state legislation requires us to prioritize replacement based on:

- Focusing on areas with lowerincome residents and other disadvantaged communities.
- Focusing on areas with children with elevated blood lead levels.
- Coordinating the replacement of lead service lines with other capital improvement projects for the most efficient use of grant funding.

By applying for Minnesota's Energy Assistance Program, homeowners and renters may also qualify for Minnesota's Weatherization Assistance Program and receive free home improvements to help save energy and ensure a warm, healthy, safe home.

### **Cold Weather Rule**

The Cold Weather Rule is now in effect. The Cold Weather Rule means that if you can't pay your home heat bill, your heat can't be shut off Oct. 1-April 30. If you get a notice about disconnecting your primary heat source, make sure to immediately contact the utility and set up a payment plan.



# Parking Rules Refresher

s Bryn Mawr grows and welcomes new businesses and residents, here are a few parking reminders for our shared city streets. It's been a long time for most of us since we memorized these rules for a driver's exam!

- No parking within 5 feet of a driveway or alley entryway, measured from where the curb meets the driveway.
- No parking within 10 feet of a fire hydrant.
- No parking within 20 feet of a crosswalk or intersection unless there is a sign or parking meter.
- No parking within 30 feet of a stop sign or traffic light, unless there is a sign or parking meter.
- No vehicle may be parked over 72 hours. A vehicle missing vital parts will be towed.
- Vehicles must be parked within 12 inches of the curb and parked in the direction of traffic flow.
- No parking for vehicles over 10,000 pounds unless the vehicle is loading, unloading or providing a service.
- No commercial vehicle parking unless the vehicle is loading, unloading or providing a service.

Our neighbors supported the Bryn Mawr Neighborhood Association, Red Cross Blood drives, NorthPoint Food Shelf and an epic election day bake sale with all proceeds supporting the students at Bryn Mawr Elementary. We're ending the year collecting new and gently used mittens and gloves for the students at Anwatin Middle School and Bryn Mawr Elementary School.

Neighbors have generously donated to support BMNA programs, contractors, and communications. Our Give to the Max campaign in November raised \$610. # **Developments in Regaining Public Access to the Wirth Woods**

n late October members of the Bryn Mawr community, MPRB, the Loppet Foundation and Anwatin met up to discuss the future of the Anwatin - Wirth Woods connection near the Eloise Apartments' pond. Currently there is a rainwater runoff ditch filled with rubble that has impeded public access to the Wirth Woods, with the exception of a small temporary bridge that was put in place by residents. During the meeting all parties acknowledged that a permanent fix is necessary for the public to have safe year-round access into Wirth Woods. The Loppet suggested that if a bridge were to be built across the drainage ditch that it should be at least 7ft. wide, (preferably 15 ft. wide), and be able to support a load of at least 1,500 lbs. so that the machine that is used to

groom the winter trails will be able to cross it. This means that a professionally engineered bridge should be made, thereby ruling out the community-built Boy Scout option. Who would be responsible for funding and making this happen is still unclear, but acknowledging the problem is always the first step on the road to progress. For this Winter's ski season the Loppet Foundation recently put down fresh gravel in preparation for snow to accommodate the ski trails. This is a welcomed temporary solution as we wait to see how this issue will be permanently addressed. It is my deepest hope that through collaboration our community will regain safe public access to this crucial trail intersection.




